DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 2. Has there ever been a time in your life when it was only by the power of God that you were able to get through a difficult time? Were you able to recognize God's power at the time or was it only in hindsight that you saw him at work? What was that experience like?
- 3. **Read 2 Corinthians 9:6**. Sowing generously is not often a money issue, it's a trust issue. Who or what are you trusting in today to provide for your needs?
- 4. Paul says that when we put God first, we'll be made rich in *every* way—which could mean financially, but can also mean abundance in relationships, at home, in your health, or in finding a meaningful job. In what areas of life are you experiencing this abundance?

CHALLENGE

Step out of your comfort zone and act generously in a way that is new to you this week. Surprise someone by paying for their coffee or meal, mow your neighbor's lawn, or give to a new cause. Get creative-there are so many ways for us to live generously in our day-to-day lives.
